## Appendix 1: Tournament Mechanics, rules and important information

### 1. Tournament Mechanics

- The tournament will mainly be a single-round robin tournament.
- If there are more than 8 entries, schools will be split in to more than 1 group to compete with knock-out rounds for the last 2 rounds.

### 2. Scoring System

- Each team is composed of 5 to 15 members from the same school (Form 1 to Form 6 students).
- Each team will have 5 participants in each round. Each team will play 5 oneto-one games against its opponents in each round. If a school has got 3 wins, 4 wins and 5 wins in each round, it will be counted as a school win.
- If there is a draw game, 0.5 wins will be counted. As such, if in any round that there is 2.5-2.5 for the 2 schools involved, it will be counted as 0.5 school wins.
- If more than one schools obtain the same school WINS, at the end of the whole tournament, the final team ranking will be determined as follows:
  - 1. Number of individual wins
  - 2. Number of spread\*
- \* 'Spread' refers to the difference between the total points scored by two opposing players/teams.

## 3. <u>Information for participating Schools</u>

- All players representing their schools should have prior knowledge to play the game and must have read the Tournament Rules.
- Any form of Scrabble word list and/or tiles/letters tracking devices in any manner is not allowed during the competition to ensure that fair play is adopted.
- No matter they are taking part in the Tournament directly/indirectly, all
  participants should agree that they will not hold the Organiser(s) responsible for
  any accidents/ mishaps/ misdemeanors that may occur during the course/leading
  to the course of/after the event.

#### 4. Tournament Rules

- As this will be a HKSPA-recognised tournament, all rules adopted will be complied with the related regulations of the Hong Kong Scrabble Players Association (HKSPA). By that, the WESPA (World English-language Scrabble Players Association) rule version 3 is adopted. You may go to http://www.wespa.org/rules/index.shtml to download and study the rule.
- Time allowed: 25 minutes per player,
- Dictionary: CSW15
- Challenge penalty: 5 points challenge penalty per challenged word
- Two- and three-letter word lists will be provided during all games. Players are allowed to refer to it but they are not allowed to write on it. They cannot bring in their own word list too.

#### 5. <u>Matters in Dispute</u>

All questions of eligibility, legitimacy in the progress and outcome of the game including walkover, forfeiture of game, alteration in the number of games played, annulment and/or invocation/reversal of final result, interpretation of rules as well as all other matters in dispute not covered in the abovementioned rules and regulations shall be referred to the Organizing Committee whose powers are that of an arbiter and whose decision is FINAL.

#### 6. Prize

- Team Prizes
  - (1) Champion
  - (2) 1st Runner-up
  - (3) 2<sup>nd</sup> Runner-up
  - (4) 3<sup>rd</sup> Runner-up
- Individual Prizes
  - (1) High Game (the highest score in a game)
  - (2) High Word (the highest score in a move)
  - (3) Best player from a school
